- <u>Session Law 2023-65, Effective 10/1/23</u>
  - Modified § 90A-53 (a) and (b). Educational Requirements for Registered Environmental Health Specialists
    - Reduced intern periods for NCREHS registrants

(1) In addition, all applicants must (1) satisfactorily complete NC Centralized Training (CIT), a course in specialized instruction and training approved by the Board in the practice of environmental health, (2) attain NCREHS authorizations, and (3) pass the NCREHS exam

# NEARING THE END OF SECOND YEAR AFTER ENACTMENT

- Attaining authorizations AND passing full complement of exams is a lot to accomplish in 24 months
- If an intern is close to the end of their 2<sup>nd</sup> year and has not passed the exams
  - Board cannot "extend" the 2-year timeframe BUT there is an option for interns to reapply as "Intern with Previous Experience"
    - Will receive new REHS #
    - All passing scores and active authorizations will move to new number
    - Once intern has passed the full exam, they will "fast track" to full REHS status

## EH ASSOCIATE CREDENTIALING STANDARDS

- <u>Session Law 2023-90, Effective 5/1/24</u>
  - § 90A-51(2d) established a registered environmental health associate
    - "Graduated with an associate, bachelor's, or postgraduate degree and earned a minimum of 15 semester hours in the physical, biological, natural, life, or health sciences and satisfactorily completed general and specialized instruction and training in environmental health approved by the Department"
  - During first year of enactment
    - Board received 4 Associate applications
      - One registrant remains active as an Associate

## EH ASSOCIATE DUTIES

§ 90A-52(b)(2) A registered environmental health associate, directly reporting to a registered environmental health specialist, may perform all of the following duties in accordance with the rules adopted by the Commission for Public Health:

- a. Permitting and inspections of private water wells.
- b. Inspections of Category I food establishments, temporary food establishments, and limited food service establishments.
- c. Inspections of lodging establishments.
- d. Permitting and inspections of any Type II or Type III on-site wastewater systems, including system layouts and existing wastewater systems.
- e. Inspections of migrant housing.
- f. Inspections of private, public, and religious schools.
- g. Inspections of local confinement facilities.
- h. Inspections of residential care facilities.
