

Transition Support for Care Management for at-risk Children (CMARC) and Care Management for High-Risk Pregnancies (CMHRP)

Request for Information:

The North Carolina Association of Local Health Directors (NCALHD) is seeking information from qualified firms or consultants regarding potential professional and technical services. The services considered are related to upcoming transitions for the North Carolina Medicaid Care Management Programs as further described below.

Background:

NCALHD represents the eighty-six local health departments (LHDs) that serve all one hundred counties in North Carolina.

North Carolina's LHDs are the primary service providers for the North Carolina Medicaid Care Management for at-risk Children (CMARC) and Care Management for High-Risk Pregnancies (CMHRP) programs. These programs are in a transition period, as detailed in this [Program Update](#).

To date, NCALHD has worked to support LHDs during this transition plan, and to ensure continued opportunity for LHDs to provide these services.

Specific Needs:

NCALHD is seeking support from an external partner to provide guidance and technical assistance as it continues in this support role. The primary need for the contractor will be to:

- Advise and support NCALHD as it considers options for care management documentation and data management systems to manage the programs moving forward
- Support NCALHD as it facilitates conversations between LHDs and Medicaid Prepaid Health Plans (PHPs) on plan design and contractual structures
- Analyze and provide perspectives from other Medicaid care management programs that could inform the ongoing structure in North Carolina

Information Requested:

- An organizational overview from the potential partner submitting information
- Background and expertise related to any public health, delegated care management and Medicaid programs
- A high-level summary of how the potential partner could provide support during this transition
- Any questions from the partner needed to develop a full proposal
